Australian Government funded projects are approved and funded on a ratio basis of 5 to 1 by the Department of Foreign Affairs and Trade (DFAT).

We have Base Accreditation with the Department of Foreign Affairs and Trade (DFAT) which gives us access to \$150,000 per year for approved developmental projects and \$700,000 for Church Partnership Program (CPP) in Papua New Guinea.
